

TO: Kyle May, father of McKenna May, TAKE NOTICE that a Motion for Permanent Custody of the child was filed in the Court of Common Pleas, Juvenile Division, Clinton County, Ohio, on March 20, 2024 after the child was adjudicated to be dependent on following an evidentiary hearing and was placed in the temporary custody of Clinton County Children Services on August, 9, 2022. This Motion seeks to modify the current order of temporary custody of the above-named child to an order permanently divesting you of all parental rights and obligations to the child. A hearing on the said motion will held on June 12, 2024, at 1:30pm., in the Juvenile Courtroom, 2d Floor, Clinton County Courthouse, Wilmington, Ohio; and **you, Kyle May, father of McKenna May, are ordered to appear** before the Court at that time and place to answer the motion.

You are hereby notified that:

1. Any party is entitled to a lawyer in all proceedings in Juvenile Court. If a party cannot afford a lawyer and meets certain requirements, the Court will appoint one upon request. If you wish to have a lawyer but believe you cannot afford one, call the Juvenile Court Clerk at (937) 382-2391, Monday through Friday, from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
2. An order granting permanent custody will vest in Clinton County Children Services all parental rights, duties, and obligations, including the right to consent to adoption, and divests you of any and all parental rights, privileges, and obligations, including the privilege of reasonable visitation, the right to consent to adoption, the privilege to determine the child's religious affiliation, the right to inherit from the child and the right of the child to inherit from the parent, and the responsibility for support.
